8. TEACHING

(a) *Areas of special interest and accomplishments*

My teaching has long focused on trusts law. I taught English trust law at Oxford, Canadian trust law at Western University and at Allard Law, and Israeli trusts law at the Hebrew University. I developed a seminar in Comparative and Offshore Trusts Law and Practice, and taught it at Georgetown Law Center, The University of Melbourne, the Hebrew University, Western University, the University of Virginia, Allard Law and elsewhere.

I have also long been concerned with encouraging younger scholars to take up research in trusts and estates. In June 2025 I have been able to convince the Society of Trusts and Estates Practitioners Canada (STEP Canada) to endow a new doctoral scholarship, meant to support doctoral research at Canadian universities in the areas of trusts, estates, taxation, and fiduciary responsibility, with a focus on Canadian law and practice.

Other teaching includes a methodological seminar for LLM students, property law, business associations (including M&A), comparative law, a legal history workshop and introductory courses in the common law tradition and in middle-eastern law.

My teaching philosophy is focused on turning each class meeting into a discussion, letting students speak and making technical legal topics accessible, exciting and interesting. I do so by alerting students to the socio-economic consequences of different legal instruments and rules. I also try to make each class light-hearted to the extent possible.

I have long had a special interest in creating original courses from scratch. At the Hebrew University I created four wholly original courses from scratch: a seminar in Comparative and Offshore Trusts Law and Practice; a course in Israeli trusts law; an introduction to the common law tradition; and an introduction to middle eastern law.

9. SCHOLARLY AND PROFESSIONAL ACTIVITIES

(a) Areas of special interest and accomplishments

Most of my research is in the trusts area. Much of it is comparative: I study the law and legal practice of many countries. I use almost every research method common in legal research. I have shown empirically that normatively problematic trust features are common in practice,³ that some U.S. states lead the world in making problematic reforms to their law of trusts, and that contrary to claims that often serve to justify such reforms, there is no evidence showing that abolition of trust law's traditional protective restrictions produces increased demand for fiduciary services.⁴

Since my promotion to Associate Professor in 2018 I put great emphasis on researching in collaboration. In two cases I collaborated with past students, as a means of launching them on a potential research career. I have a great interest in growing a new generation of trusts and equity researchers.
